THE TOPIC

Around the country, colleges and universities are seeing the wisdom of creating case management positions to aid in their comprehensive campus behavioral intervention efforts. Case managers are vital, helping to manage the intake side of behavioral intervention efforts, coordinate interventions, and then monitor follow-up and post-intervention periods. They are the link that keeps at-risk individuals on the institutional radar screen, and coordinates multiples sources of care and campus/community resources.

As case management models evolve, we are seeing case management run not only out of campus counseling centers, but also out of student affairs divisions. Some campuses have

case managers in both counseling and student affairs, and Virginia Tech has added an HR Case Manager as well. BIT Chairs are functioning as case managers on many campuses, and case managers are being appointed to chair behavioral intervention teams on campuses where full-time chairs are needed.

Case management models make sense in a variety of settings, including:

- Campuses with high volumes of behavioral intervention needs
- Campuses where long-term monitoring and support needs exceed the staff and resource availability of the BIT
- Campuses where coordination/liaison between multiple teams is needed (student BIT, staff BIT, Threat Assessment Team, etc)
- Campuses where the BIT needs a full time coordinator, who also serves a case management role

In this NaBITANAR, we'll hear from four case managers who coordinate student affairs and counseling functions on their campuses. They'll share how their models function, and talk about how their roles are evolving and changing as behavioral intervention efforts become more formalized on their campuses. They will share some of their strategies for success, and discuss with moderator Brett Sokolow how their efforts integrate with their campus behavioral intervention functions. Brett will also share some ideas for how other campuses can use case managers and integrate them into existing or developing behavioral intervention models, including the NCHERM CUBIT model. Q&A with the audience will allow for a great exchange between the presenters and participants.
